Approval of February 2023 Minutes Motion to approve February 2023 meeting minutes carried with two amendments (Updating a typo for approved IA funding from 0.125 FTE to 0.75 FTE each, and stating that PFC had already set aside a budget for Outdoor Education instead of it needing to be approved).

Treasurer's Report/Financial Summary

Yotam Levine reported on the February 2023 income and expenses for the PFC. The detailed report is available on Konstella.

Fourth Grade / Fifth Grade

4th and 5th grade EL students have been preparing to take the ELPAC test and began the first section today.

4th and 5th grade teachers have planned fun grade level activity days to be sold at the auction and Teacher for the Day opportunities which will be sold online starting this Friday.

4th graders have been writing poetry and will be using inspiration from many sources to write a variety of poems and then design a creative background using many different art materials.

All 4th grade students are reading Dear Mr. Henshow and applying summarizing strategies.

Fractions are our main focus in math. We are learning to make equivalent fractions, compare fractions with like and different denominators, adding and subtracting fractions and solving real world problems involving fractions.

In science 4th graders are wrapping up our study of energy looking at waves. When we return after Spring Break, we will begin our Life Science unit which includes dissecting a squid.

Our final field trip this spring will be to the Bancroft Garden to learn about plant adaptations.

In science 5th graders are finishing their tide pool books in preparation for beach day at camp. After Spring Break we will begin Life Science including doing owl pellet dissections.

Outdoor School is coming March 27-30. There will be a zoom meeting next week to go over final camp preparations.

Plans are in progress for the 5th grade celebration and Mr. Larson is working on a song that he will be teaching the 5th grade Class of 2023 to perform at the ceremony.

Principal's Corner

Mrs. Dunn provided updates on:

- PD day happened March 13th
- Reminder May 16th is the open house
- Fifth grade celebration is on June 1st
- Summer School 2023 at Bancroft. It will begin on June 7th and end on June 30th, 4.5 hours a day
- Outdoor Education next year, there is an increase in cost to \$450 per student

- The MCs for the show will be students, and teachers are encouraged to nominate outgoing students for this role.
